**Reserve early!** Reserve campsites, yurts and cabins two days to nine months in advance by phone, Reservations Northwest (1-800-452-5687), or online through [www.oregonstateparks.org](http://www.oregonstateparks.org).

Nestled in a lush coastal forest on a sand spit between the Pacific Ocean and Netarts Bay, Cape Lookout State Park is a destination for sightseers, hikers, beachcombers and campers who appreciate a harmonious blend of nature and recreation.

### Universal Access

2 campsites (C35, C37), 4 yurts (C43, C44, C50, C52), and 1 cabin (Tillamook) are accessible to campers with disabilities.

### Discovery Season

From October 1–April 30, you can rent a full, electric or tent site for less. At most state parks, including Cape Lookout, you can save \$4 off summer rates. Deluxe cabins are also discounted during the Discovery Season.

### Day-Use Area Parking Fees

Cape Lookout requires a day-use parking permit year-round. You'll need to display either a daily permit, a 12- or 24-month permit, an Oregon Pacific Coast Passport or your camping receipt. Your camping receipt is equal to a daily permit for those days registered.

### Yurt and Cabin Comforts

Enjoy the year-round comforts of a yurt or deluxe log cabin. Yurts are domed tents with structural support, wooden floors, lockable doors, lights, heating and beds with vinyl covered mattresses. A bunk bed sleeps three, and a futon couch sleeps two. Our deluxe cabins, which also accommodate five campers, have refrigerators, microwave ovens, barbecue grills and bathrooms with showers. They are located next to the day-use area. All cabin and yurt sites have fire rings and picnic tables. Maximum 2 pets (cats and/or dogs only) in the pet friendly facilities; donations accepted.

### Miles of Hiking Trails

The Cape Trail, a 2.4-mile trek to the tip of Cape Lookout, begins at the trailhead parking area 2.6 miles south of the park entrance on the Three Capes Scenic Route. The tip of the cape offers prime whale watching during Gray whale migrations.



The South Trail winds 1.8 miles from the trailhead to the beach south of the cape, and the North Trail extends 2.3 miles north to the park's day-use area.

You can follow a 1/4-mile, self-guided nature trail, beginning near the campground registration booth or the day-use area. Another short loop trail along Jackson Creek displays the park's fish habitat restoration efforts (begins off the park entrance road east of the RV dump station). Trail guides are available at the registration booth, or from a park host.

### Three Capes Scenic Route

The northern end of this loop begins in Tillamook and winds along the shore of Tillamook Bay to Cape Lookout and two other capes with state parks. **Cape Meares State Scenic Viewpoint**, north of Cape Lookout, features an historic lighthouse, hiking trails, picnic areas and an unusually shaped Sitka Spruce known as the "Octopus Tree." The lighthouse is open daily, April 1–October 31. Watch for whales and offshore seabird nesting. **Cape Kiwanda State Natural Area**, with its sculptured sandstone cliffs, is a picturesque location for wave watching.

South of Cape Lookout, **Clay Myers State Natural Area** at Whalen Island is an ecological wonderland centered in the Sandlake Estuary.

**Munson Creek Falls State Natural Site**, off U.S. 101, six miles south of Tillamook, has a trail to a viewpoint for the highest waterfall (319 feet) in the Coast Mountain Range.
