Reserve early! Reserve campsites, yurts and group areas two days to nine months in advance by phone: Reservations Northwest (1-800-452-5687). Campsites and yurts also are reservable online through www.oregonstateparks.org.

Towering sea cliffs contribute both scenic beauty and protection for Sunset Bay State Park's campground and inviting, sandy bayside beach.

Yurts!

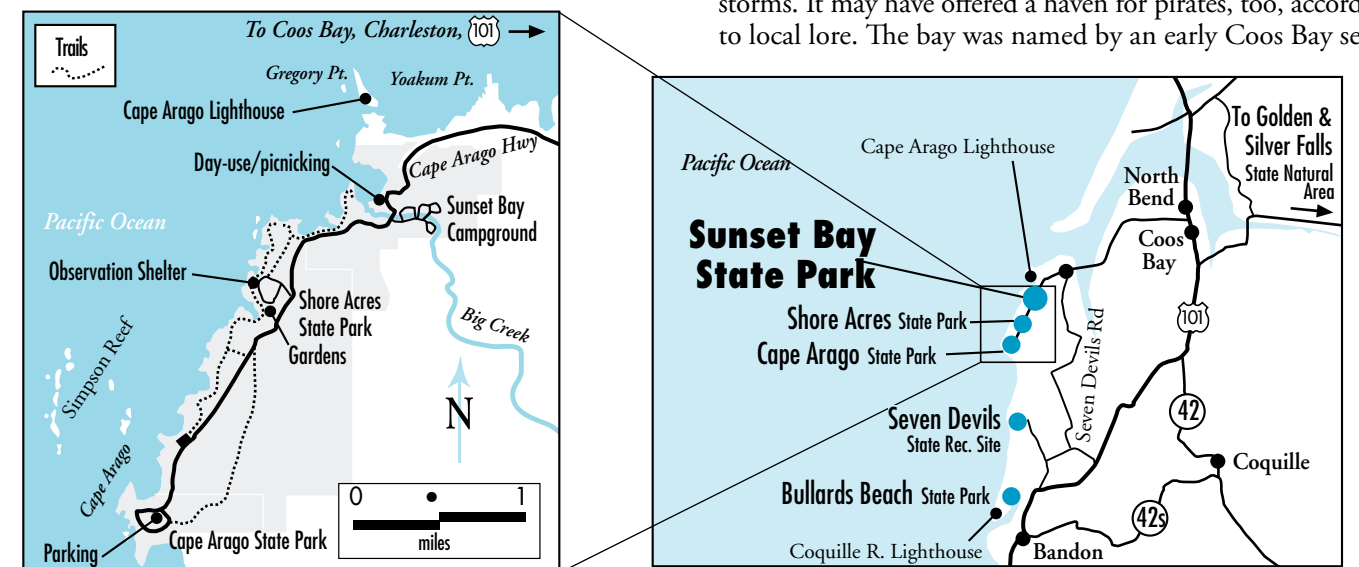
Enjoy the year-round comforts of a domed tent with structural support, a wood floor, lockable wooden door, lights, heating and beds with vinyl covered mattresses. A bunk bed sleeps three, and a futon couch sleeps two. A fire ring, picnic table and paved parking are right outside. Maximum 2 pets (cats and/or dogs only) in the pet friendly facilities; donations accepted.

More to See

Shore Acres State Park, once the grand estate of a pioneer lumberman and shipping baron, Louis Simpson, is now a park featuring spectacular ocean views and seven acres of eyepleasing gardens. A formal garden with restored plants and flowers acquired from around the world, an oriental-style pond and two rose gardens compose an impressive floral display. Thousands of decorative holiday lights give the gardens a festive seasonal glow Thanksgiving through New Year's Eve. Trails lead to a secluded ocean cove at Simpson Beach and to viewpoints along rugged sandstone cliffs that make the park

one of the best wave and whale watching locations on the Oregon coast. A fully enclosed observation building, popular for storm watching, stands on the site once occupied by the estate's mansion. Pets are not permitted in Shore Acres State Park.

Cape Arago State Park borders Shore Acres to the south. Originally part of the Simpson estate, it was used by the Coast Guard and U.S. Army as a radio station and lookout site during World War II. Trails lead to a sandy beach where you can explore tidepools, fish and see colonies of seals and sea lions.

Day-Use Area Parking Fees

Day-use parking permits are required all year at Shore Acres. You will need to display a daily permit, 12- or 24-month permit, Oregon Pacific Coast Passport, or your camping receipt. A camping receipt is equal to a daily permit for those days registered. You can buy a daily permit at the park's entrance booth or from a nearby vending machine. The Friends of Shore Acres information center and major state park offices throughout the state sell 12- or 24-month permits.

Sailors' Haven

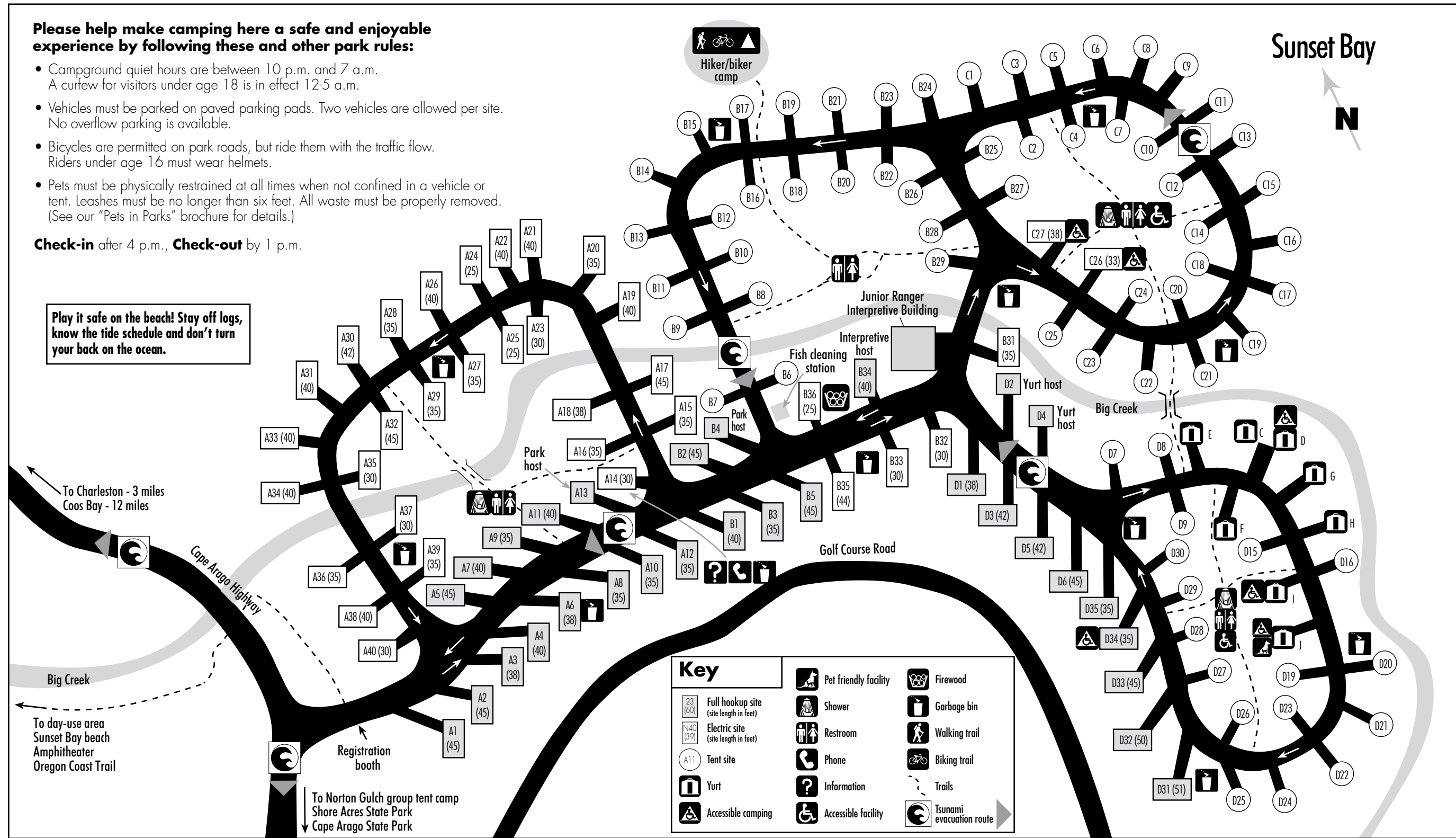
Partially enclosed by steep sandstone bluffs with a narrow passage to the sea, Sunset Bay was once used by fishing boats and other shallow draft vessels as a safe harbor during ocean storms. It may have offered a haven for pirates, too, according to local lore. The bay was named by an early Coos Bay settler.

Please help make camping here a safe and enjoyable experience by following these and other park rules:

- Campground quiet hours are between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. A curfew for visitors under age 18 is in effect 12-5 a.m.
- Vehicles must be parked on paved parking pads. Two vehicles are allowed per site. No overflow parking is available.
- Bicycles are permitted on park roads, but ride them with the traffic flow. Riders under age 16 must wear helmets.
- Pets must be physically restrained at all times when not confined in a vehicle or tent. Leashes must be no longer than six feet. All waste must be properly removed. (See our "Pets in Parks" brochure for details.)

Check-in after 4 p.m., **Check-out** by 1 p.m.

Play it safe on the beach! Stay off logs, know the tide schedule and don't turn your back on the ocean.
